Comments: The 180-ton¹ Massachusetts Privateer Bark *Daniel* was commissioned on 13 September 1779 under Commander James Montaudevert² (or Mountadere).³ She was listed as being armed with eight guns and as having a crew of twenty men. Her \$10000 Continental bond and £4000 Massachusetts bond were signed by Montaudevert and by Daniel McNeill and Gustavus Fellows, both of Boston, Massachusetts. Fellows and others of Boston were listed as *Daniel's* owners.⁴ It is possible that this *Daniel* is the same vessel as the other Massachusetts Privateer *Daniel*.
